

Regulation for Paper Submission to *Electrochemistry*

Revised Feb.12, 2020

1. General Scope and Types of Papers

(1) "*Electrochemistry*" is devoted to the publication of research papers in the fields of electrochemistry and applied physical chemistry. The following types of papers in English (or Japanese) may be submitted.

1. *Article*. Full length papers containing original results including significant conclusions or facts.
2. *Technological report*. Technological reports containing new information, valuable data and methods directly related to industrial technology.
3. *Note*. Short notes containing new facts, significant data and methods, if fragmentary, not exceeding three pages in the printed form.
4. *Communication*. Communications containing new facts, valuable data and methods, and requiring prompt publication, not exceeding three pages in the printed form.
5. *Comprehensive paper*. Comprehensive papers that draw conclusions from the treatment of existing data, include significant new data, or make new experimental results or theoretical views of broad interest.
6. *Review*. Papers presenting a general survey of an outstanding subject in Electrochemistry.

(2) Only original contributions will be considered except for *Comprehensive Papers and Reviews*. However, *Articles* or *Technological Reports*, which contain a significant improvement over the results already published as Communications in this journal or elsewhere, will be considered.

2. Submission and Refereeing of Manuscripts

- (1) Authors should prepare their manuscripts in accordance with both these regulations and the "Instructions for Authors", otherwise the manuscripts will not be accepted.
- (2) Authors should submit electronic files of a complete set of the manuscript with tables, figures and/or pictures via the Electrochemical Society of Japan online submission website :

- (3) The date received is the day on which the editor receives the manuscripts.
- (4) The decision to accept a manuscript for publication will be made by the editorial committee.
- (5) The editors may ask that a manuscript be revised. If the revised paper is not submitted within two months, the

manuscript may be regarded as having been withdrawn.

3. Proofs

Authors will receive the proofs, and are requested to correct and return them. No revision, insertion, or deletion of words other than misprints by the publisher will be accepted. The corrected proofs must be returned within 48 hours.

4. Corrections

If the editorial committee accepts the correction, the corrections may be published. A publishing fee will be required in accordance with the regulations.

5. Article Processing Charge

If the submitted manuscript is accepted, authors should pay the fee listed in the Table of Article Processing Charges. A reduced fee is applied to regular, senior and student members of The Electrochemical Society of Japan.

6. Copyrights

The copyrights of all kinds of papers printed and published in electronic media shall be determined in the documents of The COPYRIGHT LICENSE AGREEMENT with The Electrochemical Society of Japan.

COPYRIGHT LICENSE AGREEMENT

with The Electrochemical Society of Japan

(February 12, 2020)

By filling the checkbox in website of the **Electrochemical Society of Japan** (“ECSJ”) in relation to submission of manuscript, the author (“Author”) of the manuscript to be submitted to the ECSJ (“Manuscript”) shall acknowledge and agree to the following terms and conditions with respect to the grant of the copyright license in the Manuscript and its supporting information (“Supporting Information”), including the published version in any format (if the Manuscript is not accepted by the ECSJ or withdrawn prior to acceptance by the ECSJ, the license hereunder and the following terms and conditions will be null and void):

1. Copyright License

The Author shall grant the ECSJ the exclusive license of all copyright interests throughout the world to edit, adapt, translate, reproduce, and publish the Manuscript, and shall grant the ECSJ a non-exclusive license of all copyright interests throughout the world to edit, adapt, translate, reproduce, and publish the Supporting Information, in all formats, in all media, and by all means (whether now existing or in future devised). This Copyright License Agreement will be valid during the full term (to the extent the longest term of copyright in the Manuscript among all jurisdictions) of the copyright in the Manuscript throughout the world (including all renewals, extensions, and reversions). The license specified above may be transferable by the ECSJ and shall include the right to sub-license. The ECSJ may sell or distribute the Manuscript within a journal, on its own, or with other related material, in all media and by all means. The Author shall acknowledge and agree that the license above shall be granted to the ECSJ without any payment of consideration including license fee and royalty, by whatever name such consideration may be called.

2. The ECSJ Copyright Ownership

The Author acknowledges that: (i) it is the formal policy of the ECSJ to hold an exclusive license of the copyrights to all copyrightable material in its technical publications and to the individual contributions contained therein, in order to protect the material against any unauthorized copying and other misuse, at the same time, to facilitate the appropriate reuse of this material by others, (ii) the ECSJ may respond to such request at its sole discretion in case of a request from third parties, including but not limited to Reproduction Rights Organizations such as the Copyright Licensing Agency, the Copyright Clearance Center and document delivery suppliers, to republish all or part of the material which the ECSJ publishes, (iii) the ECSJ distributes its technical publications throughout the world and does so by various means, including but not limited to hard copy, microfiche, microfilm, and electronic media, and (iv) the ECSJ also abstracts and may translate its publications and manuscripts contained therein, for inclusion in various compendiums, collective works, databases and similar publications.

3. Author Responsibilities

The Author shall represent and warrant the following to the ECSJ:

- (a) the submitted Manuscript is the original work of the Author and any other co-authors of the Manuscript, if any (collectively “Author(s)” in Clauses 3 and 4) and not copied (in whole or in part) from any other work or matter. If the Manuscript includes copyright works of persons other than the Author(s), the Manuscript is substantially the original work of the Author(s) and all necessary permissions have been obtained by such other persons for use of such copyright works of such other persons.
- (b) the Manuscript has not been and will not be published, in any formats, in any media and by any means, prior to publication by the ECSJ.
- (c) the exercise of the rights granted to the ECSJ under this Copyright License Agreement will not infringe the copyright of any person or result in any breach of confidentiality or the breach of any contract or of any law.
- (d) the Author(s) except for the Author, if any, acknowledge and agree to the terms and conditions of this Copyright License Agreement, and do not object to the grant of all licenses of the Manuscript and the Supporting Information hereunder and the assumptions of any liens hereunder.

The Author shall indemnify and hold harmless the ECSJ from damages, expenses and any other losses (including any lost profits and attorney's fees to a reasonable extent) incurred by the ECSJ due to any breach of the Author's representations and warranties in this Clause 3.

4. Retained Rights/Terms and Conditions

The Author(s) may, without seeking permission from the ECSJ:

- (a) reproduce/republish portions of the Manuscript (including the abstract);
- (b) photocopy the Manuscript and distribute such photocopies and distribute the PDF of the Manuscript which the ECSJ makes available to the corresponding Author of the Manuscript after publication for personal or professional use only, provided that any such copies may not be offered for sale;
- (c) republish the Manuscript in the scholarly, research papers of the Author(s) in printed form and make available the PDF mentioned in (b) above in the theses of Author(s) via any internal website that the university of the Author(s) may have for the deposition of theses;
- (d) make available the PDF mentioned in (b) above via the personal website(s) of the Author(s) or via the Intranet of the organization(s) where the Author(s) works;
- (e) revise or adapt the Manuscript and reproduce adaptations of the Manuscript for any purpose other than the commercial exploitation of a manuscript similar to the original;
- (f) reproduce, perform, transmit, and otherwise communicate the Manuscript to the public in spoken presentations (including those which are accompanied by visual material such as slides, overheads and computer projections), and;
- (g) upload ONLY Proofread Manuscript by the Author(s) (NOT PDF file created by publishers) on institutional repositories or publicly accessible networks.

Nonetheless, all copyright credits in all republications or reproductions under Clause 4 shall be given to the source and the ECSJ, and all recipients of such republications or reproductions shall be sufficiently informed so that they will not further disseminate or copy the Manuscript.

The Author(s) shall submit a written request to the ECSJ and obtain the ECSJ's prior written consent for any use other than those specified in items (a) to (g) of Clause 4 above. All cases of republications and reproductions of the Manuscript under Clause 4 shall be accompanied by an acknowledgement of the first publication of the Manuscript by the ECSJ with the following citation:

5. Revision of the Agreement

The above-mentioned agreement can be unilaterally changed by The Electrochemical Society of Japan. However, the manuscript submitted before the revision will not be effective retroactively without the author's consent.

6. Governing Law/Jurisdiction

This Copyright License Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the Laws of Japan. Any dispute arising in connection with this Copyright License Agreement shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Tokyo District Court as the court of first instance.
